Music

Congratulations to the students on their Spring Concert performances! As the year comes to a close, students are working on the following units: 4K/K – barred instrument exploration & technique: how to hold mallets, how to take off bars, and how to carry instruments safely. **1st** – quarter and eighth note rhythms. They'll be able to sing, speak, and play four beat patterns well by the end of the year. 2nd – question & answer and improvisation. They'll be able to create four beat patterns of improvisation on both instruments and vocally. **3rd** – three sounds on a beat. Ask them how many different ways this can happen, and to perform the 'Super Hero Jam' for you! **4th/5th** – syncopation. These energetic songs are challenging because the rhythm does not fall on the beat. Ask them to play 'Bump Up Tomato' or sing 'Alabama Gal". **6th** – form in pop music. The students will be able to analyze the repeating sections of a song and categorize them into sections: verse, chorus, intro, bridge, etc. Maybe use their netbooks and create some music of their own! **7th** – wrapping up world music with a final project presentation on the country of their choice. **8th** – after the concert we learned one more fun piece on the instruments, 'Rockin' Robin Rondo.' What a fun year it's been!

WORLD LANGUAGES

Grades K-2 have had a wonderful year learning Spanish pronunciation (the Spanish "r" can be challenging), and an overview of basic vocabulary. Colors, numbers, days of the week, seasons, family members, body parts, animals and clothes. They will perform a song in Spanish at the middle school Deutsch Off competition. Grades 3-5 have learned vocabulary related to colors, numbers, days of the week, family members, animals and food! Students wrote and illustrated a story in French on their netbooks for their Spring project.

The **middle schoolers** will continue posting in German on our World Language classroom blogs and learning new vocabulary related to family/home, celebrations/holidays and the weather. The **8**th graders competed at UW-Madison's German Day in five areas of competition – spelling, charades, Pictionary, poetry and skits. The **7**th graders are learning weather vocabulary and are focusing on reading, writing and translating longer paragraphs. The **6**th graders focused on family/home life vocabulary and are developing their accents!
