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1 Login

The first step is to login to TeacherEase. Once you have entered the Internet:

- Go to www.TeacherEase.com

The home page describes the basic features of TeacherEase. Feel free to browse the site. Before you can set up or use any of these features, you will need to login:

- Type in your email address and password. Typically you will use the email address and password supplied by the school. Your password will be supplied by the TeacherEase administrator at your school (unless you registered online).
- Click "Log in" to access your school data.



Once you've logged in from the site's main page, you can log out and log back in from within the program.

- Choose to have your email address remembered on the logged in computer.
- If you ever forget your password, click "Forgot your password?". This will allow TeacherEase to automatically email your password to you.

2 Account Profile

View/modify your account information. Change your name, email address, password and other account preferences.

The first time you login, you will be asked to change your password. TeacherEase will display the "Account Profile" page. Choose a password that is easy for you to remember, but hard for someone else to guess. There are no limitations on the characters used for passwords. Passwords are case sensitive.

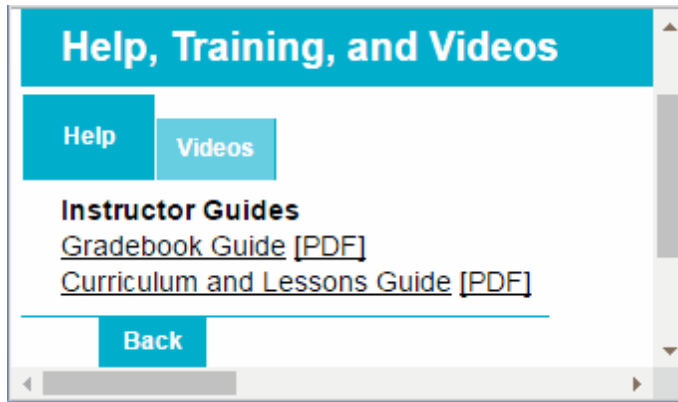
Note: The standard browsing mode allows you to browse TeacherEase securely, with the best performance. Set "Browse Securely" to "Yes" under the "Preferences" tab if you want to encrypt all the pages with SSL (secure socket layer). This will be slightly slower but even more secure.

Note: If you forget your password, click on "Forgot your password?" on the "Login" page and it will be emailed to you.

Access user documentation, online help, and instructional videos.

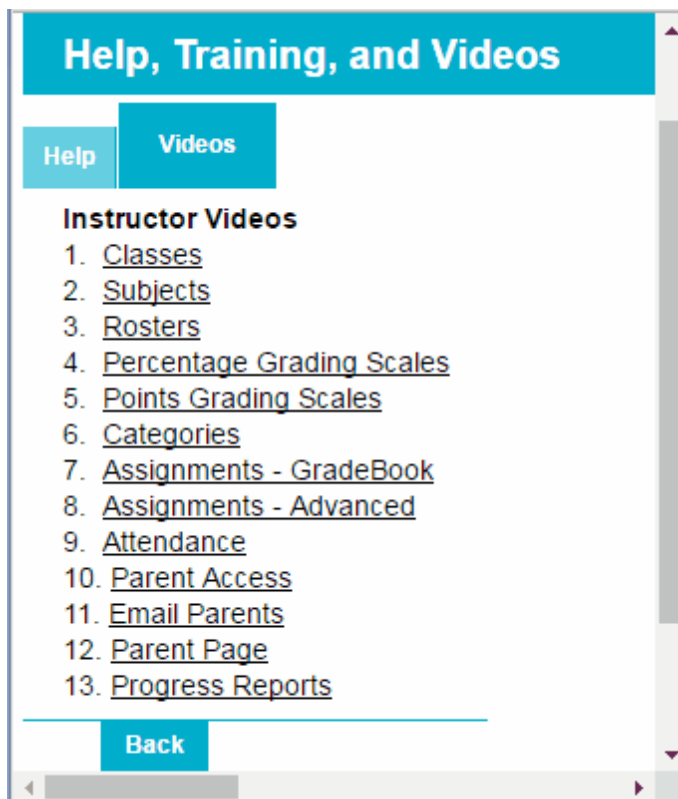

4 Instructor Main

Once you've logged in, you will find yourself on the "Instructor Main" page. This allows you to easily access TeacherEase functionality. For example: adding subjects, creating curriculum, lessons, and linking to standards.

Navigate the site using either the dropdown menus or links. Links are configurable to provide easy access to those you use the most often. The news feed is also configurable; receive the information you need in a timely manner. Additionally, a summary of upcoming assignments is displayed in the far right column.

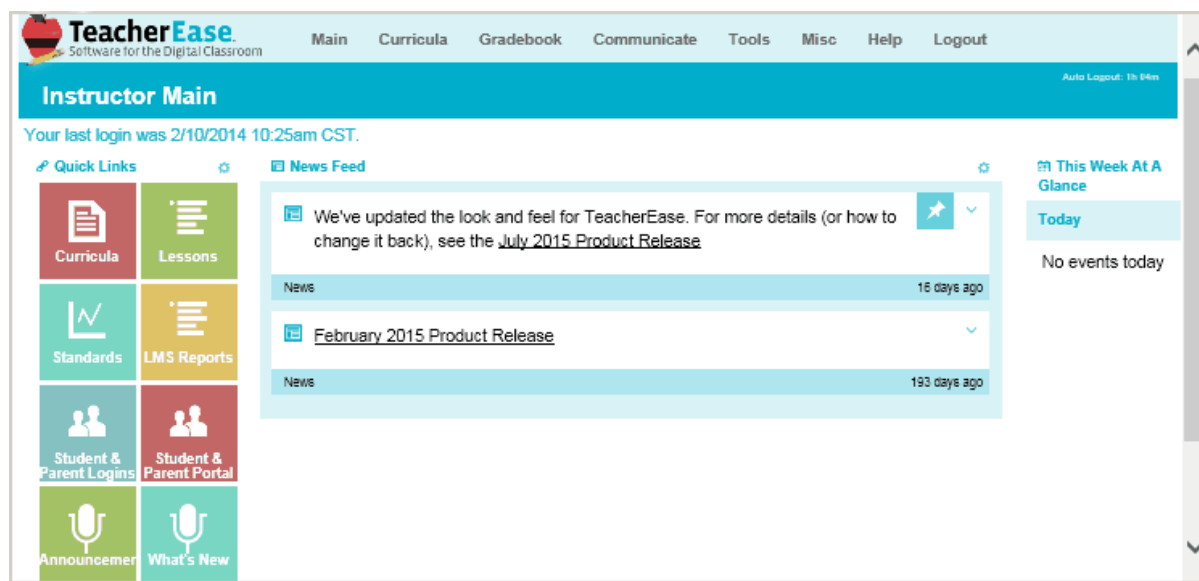
Use the  icon to configure the links and news feed.

To get back to "Instructor Main" at any time, go to the top of the page and click the **Main** tab. These two names are synonymous. We will refer to "Instructor Main" as "Main" throughout the rest of the guide.

Throughout this guide we'll use the following convention to guide you through the appropriate web pages.

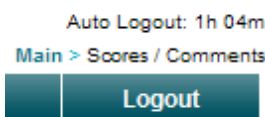
Main > Curricula Setup

This notation means start at the "Main" page and click on the "Setup" link under the "Curricula" heading.



What's New? is updated after every new release. View details to see what's changed.

The Help tab gives you access to context sensitive online help, videos, email support and feedback. See "Help & Video" for more details.



Control your session timer: Click on any page to reset the timer back to the default minutes. **Note:** Minutes can be set at Main > Account Profile. Navigation breadcrumbs are provided to help you keep track of which page you're on.

Note: You can access TeacherEase from anywhere via the Internet. This means you can use it from school, home, or anywhere you have an Internet connection. You can use a Mac, PC, or other computing device – as long as it's connected to the Internet.

Add a link to Favorites: Select a link from the "Links" box, drag it to the desired position in the "Favorites" box. **Note:** Displayed favorites are shown in gray in the links box.

Remove a link from Favorites: Select a link from the "Favorites" box and drag it to either the "Links" box, or the the trash bin. **Note:** Links that aren't favorites are shown in blue.

Format links, headers, spacing: To reorder favorites drag them to the desired location. The black headings can also be moved, as needed. Drag the "Favorites" header or "<Blank Line>" to additionally format the page. **Note:** Blank lines can be inserted multiple times.



5 Overview

The **Curriculum and Lessons** portion of TeacherEase provides a framework for creating comprehensive curriculum, linked to standards, for your classes. Build and manage your curriculum; align curriculum units, lessons, and assignments. Associate standards and digital resources to any portion of your curriculum.

Start by completing setup to customize your curriculum/lessons, set up your classes and assign standards to them. Import common core, state, and/or district defined standards into your classes. Teachers can also define additional skills for their classes and track student performance versus those skills. TeacherEase uses the terminology "standards" even if you type the skills in yourself.

Once setup is complete, teachers can create their own curriculum units, or import district/school defined curricula, when available. Curriculum units typically include topics or a collection of content to be taught for a specified timeframe. They lay the foundation from which individual lessons can be developed. Start with "scope and sequence" information, add timeframes, standards, resources, and more details as you build the curriculum.

Develop detailed lessons to reflect content and skills taught, and how they're assessed, for each of your classes. Define the goals and objectives for a topic being taught, timeframe for instruction, assessment of skills, project resources, standards coverage, etc. Lessons can be shared with others in your district, school or team for collaborative purposes.

Generate assignments linked to a lesson and curriculum unit. Create assignments with digital resources for students to use when completing their work. Align assignments with standards assigned to the class, curriculum, and lesson to provide standards-based assessments.

Utilize Curriculum/Lessons reports to determine adequate coverage of curriculum and standards.

6 Setup

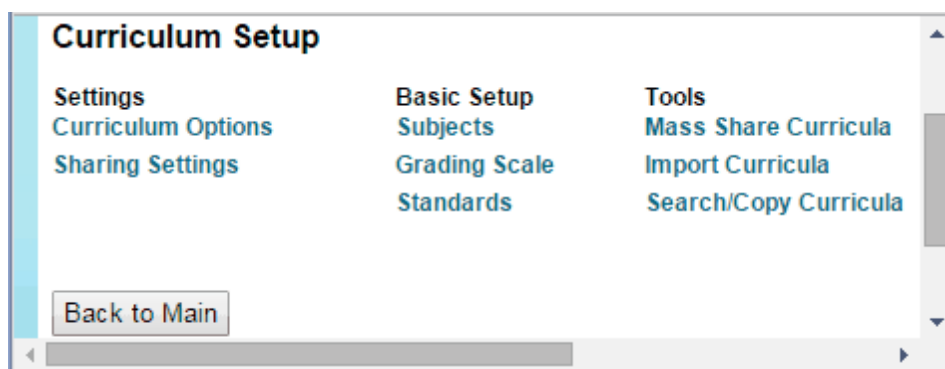
TeacherEase may be used by individual teachers or an entire school or district. When an individual teacher uses TeacherEase, they'll perform the initial setup (options, subjects, standards, etc).

The first step in using the Curriculum/Lessons portion of TeacherEase is to set up your subjects and assign standards. You can also customize details for your curriculum and lessons. In setup you can allow/disallow viewing and searching of your lessons by other teachers.

Start with the **Setup** link under **Curricula** from the "Main" menu.

We'll use the convention below when clicking a series of links:

Main > Curricula Setup




Note: If an entire school/district adopts TeacherEase, several items may be centrally managed. This means that your TeacherEase Admin may define subjects, assign curriculum details, initiate sharing, etc.

6.1 Setup Wizard

If permissions allow you to create/modify classes and students, you will be provided with the setup wizard to aide you in managing key entities for an academic year.

The setup wizard will lead you through creating an academic year and subjects.



Teachers in self-contained classrooms typically teach multiple subjects to the same students throughout the day. This is most often elementary level classrooms.

Teachers that have students that move between classes throughout the day and typically teach only a few subjects are not self-contained. This is most often junior high, middle and/or high schools.

6.2 Curriculum Options

Customize curriculum details to match how you manage curricula and lessons. Settings affect how your curriculum and lesson pages look and their corresponding fields names.

Note: Districts/schools may define uniform content and format for all curriculum and/or lessons. A district/school may choose to have everyone use the same fields/names, or they may allow individual teachers to customize fields to suit their needs. If teachers are not allowed to change curriculum or lesson fields, they can be viewed but not modified.

TeacherEase allows teachers to enter a large amount of data when creating lessons. This may not be desirable for all teachers. Some teachers will want lessons with less data. Customize the fields to configure the structure of your lessons. Modify field names, select active fields, and which fields to show on lesson pages. Chosen areas will apply to lessons for all classes/subjects. **Note:** Some districts/schools may prevent individual instructors from modifying lesson fields for their classes/subjects.

Active?: Checked fields are provided when creating/editing lessons.

Show on "Lessons" Page: Checked fields are shown in the "Details" section on lesson pages.

Popup lesson plan create/edit: Set to "Popup" for a convenient way to create/edit lessons or create assignments without leaving the "Lessons" page.

6.3 Sharing Settings

Share your curricula with multiple peers. Set defaults for sharing your assignments, lessons, units, and digital resources. When creating new curricula, sharing permissions will be defaulted to your chosen sharing settings. Teachers can collaborate with others by sharing their units, lessons, assignments and/or digital resources. Sharing allows other teachers to search for and view class materials for use "as is" or to modify as needed.

Default Sharing: Choose to share with all TeacherEase users, all teachers in your district, specific colleagues, or to not share.

My Colleagues: To share with a subset of teachers, for example, those in your school or work team, set default sharing to "My Colleagues". Then select colleagues for sharing. Use the to add as many teachers as needed. Use the **X** to remove a colleague.

Author Information: Select how you want your information displayed to colleagues when they view your shared work.

6.4 Subjects

Subjects are the different areas of study taught to your classroom of students. View and manage your subjects. **Note:** Individual teachers using TeacherEase must input their own subject information. If an entire school has adopted TeacherEase, the main office may input this information for you.

Create Subject

Adds a new subject. **Note:** A new academic year does not appear on the "Subjects" page until you have created at least one subject for that year. For more details on starting a new academic year see the "Start a New Academic Year" section.

Mass Edit

Modify many subjects at once with the same change(s). **Note:** If the school admin has assigned the subject to a course, the subject/grade level cannot be modified.

Reorder Subjects

Change the order of your subjects to suit your needs.

Edit

Changes details for a subject.

Delete

Removes a subject. **Note:** Deleting a subject also removes the subject roster, grading scale, assignments, scores, etc. Use caution deleting subjects since deleted subjects, and associated data, cannot be recovered.

Mark active/close

Mark a grading period "active" or "closed". Teachers can enter data (assignments, scores, lessons, etc.) into "active" grading periods. "Closed" grading periods are hidden for convenience (and data is preserved for posterity). Typically you'll only want one grading period active at a time.

6.4.5 Mark Active/Close Grading Period

Teachers can enter data into “active” grading periods. “Closed” grading periods are hidden for convenience (and data is preserved for posterity).

Your current grading period should be marked "active" while previous and upcoming grading periods should be marked "closed".

Curriculum and lessons are entered into active grading periods. If a grading period is closed, no modifications can be made.

Once a grading period is complete, update it to mark it closed and open the following grading period by marking it active.

Note: To aid data entry, closed grading periods are hidden from view.

6.5 Start a New Academic Year

At the beginning of each academic year, there are a few maintenance operations that must be performed in TeacherEase.

Create New Subjects: Create new subjects for the new year. On the "Create Subject" page, select the upcoming year from the "Academic Year" drop down list.

Close Old Grading Periods: Close old grading periods to preserve subject data while hiding it from view.

Main > Setup > Subjects > Mark Active/Close

Remove Old Subjects: Delete old subjects that have not been used and aren't needed for the new academic year.

6.6 Standards

Teachers may want to track student performance versus standards. They may also want to define their own skills and track student performance versus those skills. TeacherEase provides the ability to do "skills-based assessment" versus standards or your own skills.

TeacherEase allows you to track skills with "standards". Standards can be either pre-defined, or teacher defined skills. TeacherEase uses the terminology "standards" even if you type the skills in yourself.

TeacherEase is initially populated with common core, state, and district standards.

After standards have been configured for a subject, teachers can enter scores for each standard (more on this later). This allows teachers to track student performance for each standard and access useful data like: On which standards are the class struggling? On which skills is a single student struggling? Are the students make consistent progress?

Note: Your TeacherEase admin may have setup standards for you in which case you will not be able to browse and import standards.





7 Curricula

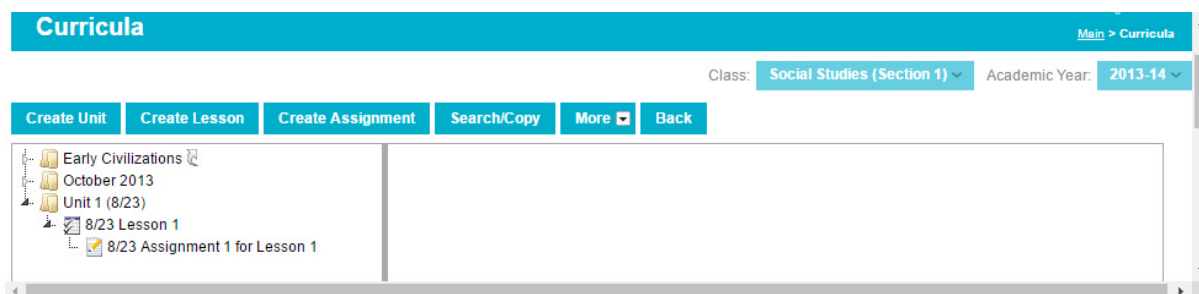
Build and manage your curriculum using a top-down approach; create curriculum units, then add lessons, and assignments. Align standards and digital resources with any portion of your curriculum.

The TeacherEase curriculum module provides a structure that assists instructors in connecting what they need to teach with the desired outcomes for student achievement. Instruction can be organized by topic/unit and timeframe for each class. Connect key objectives to learning activities and skills to be mastered. The curriculum is organized in multiple levels, creating a tree structure.

Curriculum can be created by individual teachers to reflect exactly what they teach in class, or it can be generated at the district level to reflect the "official" curricula for a course. Either approach will create a repository that can be shared.

Curriculum defines the content and skills to be taught and the time-frames allotted for instruction. Curriculum units/topics and lessons can be shared among faculty to improve collaboration. By looking at curriculum in other classes, teachers can identify gaps and repetitions in the curricula, along with opportunities for cross-curricular integration. Finally, curriculum can provide new teachers with a "cookbook" to follow when getting started.

Main > Curricula



Initially, there will be no curriculum defined and you will be prompted to create a curriculum unit/topic.

Note: The terminology "unit/topic/month" etc., is set either by yourself, at Main > Setup > Options, or by your school's TeacherEase admin. The default for new users is "Curriculum Unit".

Select the academic year and class for which to create a curriculum unit.

Create Curriculum Unit

Begin by creating a curriculum unit for the chosen class and academic year. Define the content and skills to be taught and the time-frames allotted for instruction. **Note:** Districts may want to define uniform content for course curricula. They can set permissions to allow teachers to only import or use district defined curricula. If teachers permissions are set to use district level curriculum, it can be viewed but not modified. Teachers can still create individual lessons and link them to district curriculum units.



Curriculum Page Logistics:

Create/manage the curriculum information on the page:

Utilize the preview pane to the right of the curriculum tree to view/edit existing items or create new items.

- 1) Click an item to view details in the preview pane
- 2) Left-click an item to expand the item tree and view the item details
- 3) Right click an item to popup the action menu
- 4) Point to an item, then click the down arrow to popup the action menu
- 5) Hover over the vertical line dividing the tree and preview pane, click and drag to resize the windows

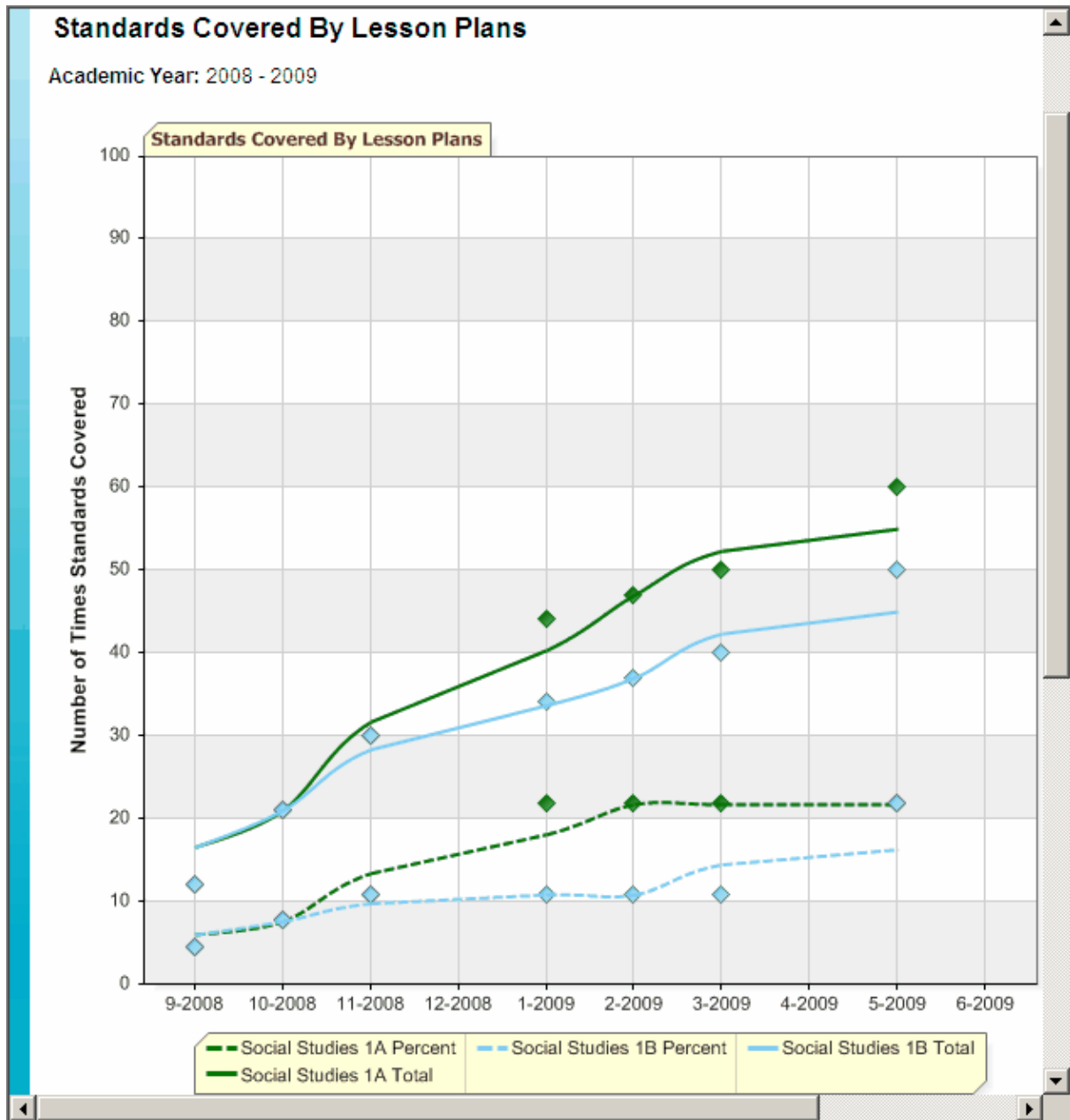
